2022 Open Call: Artis Artist Residency

At the International Studio & Curatorial Program (ISCP) in New York

Application period: March 1 - April 15, 2022 Residency Dates: August 1 - September 30, 2022

About the Residency

<u>Artis</u> is pleased to announce its third year partnering with the <u>International</u> <u>Studio & Curatorial Program (ISCP)</u> to support a two-month funded residency for a visual artist at ISCP in Brooklyn, New York. Emerging and established visual artists from Israel, who may be living anywhere in the world, are invited to apply.

The residency is an immersive experience into the art scene in New York. It is intended for a committed and self-driven artist who would benefit from dedicated time and space to develop their practice, while making new contacts with arts professionals that are part of ISCP and Artis' international communities. Artis prioritizes proposals from artists who have a clear vision for what they want to

achieve during the residency, and recognize the value of being part of a small and collaborative creative community.

The artists-in-residence is provided with a small, private studio to work that is accessible by stairs (approx. 140 square feet), and staff support during office hours. Professional development opportunities that are part of ISCP's programming, including studio visits with curators, group critiques, and trips to nearby museums and institutions, will be organized and held virtually and in-person. Artis will work closely with the artist selected to be a resource in New York and to make connections to arts professionals.

The artist-in-residence will receive the studio at ISCP and programming free of cost. The artist will receive a monthly stipend from Artis to help offset living expenses, and limited travel grants are available to support round trip travel to New York. The artist is responsible for booking their own travel, securing housing in New York, meals, art materials, and other planning associated with the residency.

Eligibility

This residency is intended for an emerging or established visual artist <u>from Israel</u> whose work addresses aesthetic, social, and political questions that inspire reflection and debate, in alliance with <u>Artis' mission</u>. Applicants must have at least two years of professional experience following completion of their degree program, and demonstrate an ongoing and active commitment to their arts practice. The applicant must be able to participate in the residency in New York in-person, and commit to dedicating at least 20 hours a week to work that is part of the residency.

Application Process & Timeline

Before applying, please review the <u>program details</u>, eligibility requirements, and learn about past participants <u>Gil Yefman</u> (2021) and <u>Assaf Evron</u> (2020). **Eligible artists may <u>apply online here</u> by 11:59pm EST on April 15, 2022.** Applicants will be notified of decisions in early June 2022.
