ISCP Dedalus Foundation Residency: Call for Applications

DESCRIPTION: The International Studio & Curatorial Program (ISCP) is pleased to announce an open call for a fully-funded residency plus materials and living stipend of \$1,000 per month for visual artists for whom the immigrant experience and social engagement are integral parts of their work. ISCP is currently accepting applications from artists who would like to be part of ISCP's unique and dynamic programming and creative community. The residency program includes 24-hour access to a private furnished studio space, regular studio visits from Visiting Critics; Field Trips to museums, galleries and other cultural venues; and participation in Artist Talks. ISCP residents become part of a growing network of international artists and curators who are ISCP alumni. An ISCP residency has often led to critical advancement in the practices of the artists and curators in residence.

In addition, the Dedalus Foundation Resident will develop a public engagement project and exhibition in Industry City/Sunset Park with the support of Dedalus Foundation and its staff. The public engagement project must work with one or more of the following constituencies: recent immigrants, undocumented immigrants, ESOL students, local community-based organizations working with families, or populations living in Sunset Park.

This residency is funded by the Dedalus Foundation.

APPLICATION PROCESS: Applications must be submitted as a single pdf. Please include all the supporting materials below in one document by email. Applicants must provide the following information: name, date of birth, place of birth, mailing address, telephone number, and email address. You may also indicate your gender, and ethnicity, though this is optional.

Curriculum Vitae.

10 images (no more than 10mb total) OR 10 images in JPEG (*.jpg) format up to 2mb each – you may also send a link to the files.

Maximum 2 video links (if applicable).

Scanned copies of 2-3 reviews (if applicable).

Scanned copies of catalogs (hard copy is accepted by mail for monographs only).

Scanned copies of two letters of recommendation from art professionals signed and printed on letterhead.

Brief project description.

Proof of eligibility to work in the United States.

Note: incomplete applications will not be reviewed.

ELIGIBILITY: Visual artists in all disciplines are invited to apply. Applicants must be based in New York City, must be eligible to work in the United States, and cannot be residents in another studio program at the same time as the Dedalus Foundation ISCP residency, and cannot be full-time students. Applicants from ISCP alumni will be considered. Applicants must be involved with the immigrant experience, demonstrate an interest in social engagement as an integral part of their work, and have at least modest speaking knowledge of English. Fluent Mandarin and Spanish speakers are encouraged to apply.

SELECTION: The selection committee reviews applications based on quality, originality and artistic merit. Other consideration factors are: the potential impact of the residency on the applicant, the applicant's past accomplishments, and preparedness to undertake the residency and related projects. Interviews with finalists will be held by the selection committee.

NOTIFICATION: Artists will be notified by November 15, 2016 for the Dedalus Foundation Residency.
